Supply List for Fountain Park Projects 2022

Chandelier Quilt (could be a great table runner (Wrena)

2 charm packs or 7 fat quarters or scraps 3 yards background fabric 5/8 yard for binding 68 x 68 batting

Christmas Tree Wall Hanging (Wrena)

2 squares of fabric each measuring 10", 9", 7', 6", and 5" Batting squares in each size Ribbon for hanger 5 buttons

Whimsical Wildflower Applique (Wrena)

This is a great stash buster project. Approximate finished size is 22 x 51

We will be creating a wall hanging featuring 3 scrappy flowers framed with 9-patch diamond borders on the top and bottom of your project. You will be learning how to do fusible applique or raw edge applique.

Background takes 15, 7 ½" scrappy fabrics or one piece that is ¾ yard 9 patch diamond borders – ½ yard from 2 contrasting fabrics Flower applique – assorted fat quarters and scraps Stems and leaves – assorted fat quarters

Chenille Denim Rug (Cathy)

Supplies needed for this are hard to determine as you can make this as big or as small as you want. We will use old jeans or jean skirts for this project. You can include colored jeans too as long as they are 100% cotton. The foundation can be a new piece of denim or several pieces pieced together. We will cut strips and sew them on in layers to fill the foundation. I would suggest a denim/heavy duty needle and heavy thread or a twin needle. You might also want to use a walking foot. You will be surprised at how nice this looks!

Scrappy Zipper Bag (Cathy)

14" zipper

1/3 yard fusible fleece

(12) Assorted prints/strips at least 3" wide. The fabrics can all be different or can be repeated if you wish.

½ yard contrasting fabric

12 inch piece of ribbon

Fat Quarter Bag (Cathy)

2 fat quarters

2 yards of ribbon

Youth Project (for adults too)

Children under 10 should be accompanied by an adult

T-Shirt Tote

1 T-Shirt (The larger the shirt the larger the tote.) No sewing needed.

Woven Fabric Basket

2 contrasting fat quarters
¹/₄ yard double sided craft fusible
20 paper clips
Optional – Buttons or rick-rack to finish the top
